Contents and target group

Independent Living at Home is an expert training course for rehabilitation-oriented teachers, managers and specialists. The course consists of 9 modules. Timing and duration of the course and number of modules can be modified based on customer needs. Minimum duration of each module is two days.

Module 1: Introduction to gerontological rehabilitation and active ageing

- » Transtheoretical model for behaviour change

Module 3: Older adult as a client in home rehabilitation, part II

- » Self-Determination Theory

- » Motivational interview

Module 4: Promoting empowerment of elderly client

- » Recognizing individual's experience and goals
- » Participating a client to planning and decision making
- » Setting personal goals

Module 5: Safety and accessibility at home » Accessibility assessment

Module 6: Implementating Individually Tailored Home Visit
